## **Education at SBT**




#### **Non Formal Education at Our Centres**

The first exposure to the literary world for children who come to us initially, is through non-formal education. Most are first generation learners who find it a task to sit and concentrate at a stretch, so play way methods are used.

The children are assessed of any previous knowledge of the academic or general awareness by the teacher after building a rapport .

This is done in a phased manner and an assessment sheet is used to know the preinterventive situation. The sheet consists of testing alphabetical and phonological awareness also with recognizing numerals and basic mathematical knowledge. After assessment, the child is placed into any of the three levels ranging from basic to advanced.



Once the child satisfactorily completes all three stages, the next step is either enrolling the child into a school or repatriating the child to his/her family.

School enrollment is determined keeping in mind:



#### **Formal School**

The NFE classes make the child school ready. The gap in their education are bridged by remedial classes.

The next step is to help the child adjust to a new formal school routine for secondary schooling, leading into diverse courses such as law, engineering, mass communication. Counselling is offered to each child and the childs mental and emotional well-being is kept in focus.

#### **Open School (NIOS)**

For those who cannot attain a level of learning to be enrolled in formal schools, a hands-on skill and a different combination of open schooling + vocational training is adopted.

# Roshni's Journey

Roshni came to SBT in 2010 at the age of 10. After the death of her father, Roshni with her 3 siblings had no alternative but to live with relatives. It was a hand to mouth existence, and with the intervention of another organisation all 4 siblings were provided Institutional care. Three of the siblings were placed in different shelter homes of Salaam Baalak Trust.



Roshni stayed at Udaan Rose home for girls and was enrolled in a Government aided school in class 5. Seeing her exceptional inclination towards academics, she was granted a fellowship to one of India's premier public schools (The Lawrence school, Sanawar H.P) in class 6 in 2012. She performed brilliantly each year and went on to serve as the Medical Inspection (MI) Prefect. Roshni scored 93.6% in her Class 12th exams and was part of the school's Basket Ball Team and represented the school at various tournaments (both national and state level). She was selected to be part of the school excursion team to Mount Kilimanjaro (Kenya).

Roshni is 19 now, pursuing a 5 years degree program in Law from Amity University and is well on her way to an enriching life.

## **Gaurav's Journey**

At the age of 10, Gaurav ran away from his home in Madhya Pradesh because his mother was not able to afford his schooling, he was found roaming around the Old Delhi Railway Station in search of a better life and with a burning ambition to study. Our field worker noticed him and he was placed in the DMRC Children Home of Salaam Baalak




Trust. Initially, Gaurav was enrolled into Class 5 in 2013. He was a quick learner and adjusted easily in school. Looking at his academic dedication, a donor agreed to sponsor his education and he was enrolled in The Lawrence School, Sanawar H.P. in class 6. His eagerness to learn, keen interest in education and consistent good performance in school carved a way for his future. He scored 84% in class 12.

Gaurav is 20 now, pursuing Graduation in Nautical Science from the Institute of Science Technology and Advanced Sciences at Chennai.

#### **Education at Doorstep - MOBILE SCHOOL**

An Abhiyan project of the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi - prompted Salaam Baalak Trust to approach urban slum communities to meet the existing challenges in elementary education.

In 2011, SBT outfitted a mini bus as a mobile school and took these facilities to those children who couldn't leave their locality to attend regular school programs. Supported by Children's Hope, the Mobile School program covers children in the urban slum areas of Seelampur and Shastri Park. At each of the two stops, the van spends three hours in activities including non-formal education, creative arts, counselling on health, hygiene, social skills, and child rights. At the end of each session supplementary nutrition is provided and a first aid service is made available.

# Child Rescues



With the pandemic having made economic woes worse, there has been a marked increase in the number of runaway children or children being sold into bonded labour. Our teams have been working hard to rescue such children.



#### **Health is our Priority**

Vaccination camps have been held for the children at different centres. Tetanus vaccine was provided to 310 children and typhoid vaccine to 82 children. We also gave the MMR vaccine to 38 children & Hepatitis B vaccine to 226 children (500 doses).
